Conflicting Concepts Two Arguments:

- 1) What is "right" is always best
- 2) What is "best" is always right





Two Arguments:

1) What is "right" is always best

(Letter of the Law)

(Literal Definition)





Two Arguments:

2) What is "best" is always right (Spirit of the Law)

(Common Sense)

Where's the true disparity?

The truth is that neither of the two concepts is "always" the acceptable outcome / result

Flexible
Variable
Dependent on situation





In the beginning referees are trained to focus on being "right"





Gradually, over time and with experience, referees are encouraged to understand the difference between "right" and "best", as competitive level increases.





It is the **duty** of the referee to penalize only those violations that matter.

It is within the referee's power to determine which violations matter.





SAFETY Is Never Ignored





Is the "Right" decision always the safest approach?





FAIRNESS Must be a Consideration





Is the "Best" decision always the fairest approach?





What is the impact of making the "right" call vs. the "best" call

significant effect?
impact upon play
on player or team
with regard to game / player
management





One team may be physical and the other team not ...

Referee may have to deal with making a "right" vs. "best" decision on what may appear to be a one-sided bias.



Remember



It is the DUTY of the referee to penalize only those violations that matter.

It is within the referee's **POWER** to determine which violations really do matter.

An infraction that has no significant impact upon play may be "best" not whistled.



Remember



An "unsafe" act can <u>never</u> be ignored whether or not it is considered to be "RIGHT" or "BEST".

Blow the whistle ... Stop the game !!
